1. Background

The Local Government Biodiversity Learning Network (LGBLN) is a learning and knowledge exchange forum established with the intention of providing a platform for municipal biodiversity management practitioners to engage in cross-functional and multisectoral dialogue. The Network is co-convened by the South African Local Government Association (SALGA), the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE), the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) and ICLEI-Local Governments for Sustainability.

The LGBLN has from its inception has been affiliated to the Biodiversity and Land Use Project, funded by the Global Environment Facility through the UNDP which aims to increase the uptake of biodiversity within regulatory officials on the municipal scale (2015-2021), as well as to ICLEI's Cities with Nature global platform.

2. The 2021 Learning Event

The learning event to be held virtually on the 22nd of September 2021 is held as a follow up to the inaugural learning event convened in March 2018; and will present an opportunity for municipal peer learning exchanges on biodiversity management for ecosystem restoration and be exposed to opportunities for funding and technical support.

The theme adopted for the learning event, i.e. 'The Decade on Ecosystem Restoration' is in line with the global 10 year ecosystem restoration programme launched by the United Nations in 2021 with the aim of restoring ecosystems following the VOVID-19 pandemic and supporting the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Municipalities play an integral role in the implementation of the SDGs, and should consequently be further empowered to restore and preserve ecosystems.
